

Social dialogue finds its roots in a long tradition of consultation and cooperation

Social and Economic Council



- Established 1950 by law, public institution
- Advisory body to government and parliament
- Three groups, 33 members:
 - employers
 - employees
 - independent experts
- Broad agenda
- SER can foster (political) stability by 'creating common ground'
- Financed by 'organised business', not government
- Secretariat of +/- 100





1. Impact of having strong dialogue as such in Netherlands

How to measure?

- → General indicators of "Outcomes":
 - Statistics on socio-economic functioning, e.g. on all SDGs. Economic growth, innovation, incomes/inequality, level of education, happiness, etc.
 - Netherlands is doing well overall, both economy as well as socially. Strong and shared belief that combination is crucial, do good on both dimensions
- → More specific indicators impact of social dialogue
 - Strike rate: very low in Netherlands



- 2. Impact of SER in general:
- Agenda impact: SER is involved in all major policy discussions and changes
 - How to measure?
 - Regular check of issues, qualitative evaluation
- SER is well seen and valued
 - → How to measure?
 - Involvement at high level of social partners
 - Wish of other groups to participate
 - Access to government and parliament



3a. Impact of concrete reports and recommendations

- Instrumental impact: SER offers advice/solutions offered that are <u>put in practice</u>
 - → often meaningfull compromises that generate broad support and help to bridge political differences.

How to measure?

- Reaction of cabinet, sent to parliament
- Evaluation/comparison policy with advice
- Downloads reports from our website
- → NB: sometimes takes years!



- 3b. Impact of concrete reports and recommendations
- conceptual or analytical impact: SER reports/advice are evidence based: lot of time & effort in shared analysis and building of a common understanding of what is the problem → helps to rationalize heated debates, also in the political arena

How to measure?

- → Citations of report, in policy briefs etc
- → Use of report in discussions / media
