- 2004 2008 : OECD (Paris), Principal Administrator, General Co-ordinator of the Metagora project: overall management and substantive leadership of the project, aimed at enhancing evidence-based assessments of human rights and democratic governance to inform policy dialogue, decision making and reform proposals. Metagora developed a participatory approach, multidisciplinary working methods, and tools for producing relevant information and policy-oriented analysis. Based on a North/South partnership, the project gathered together the expertise of leading Civil Society Organisations, National Human Rights Institutions, academic and research centres, and National Statistical Offices. It was managed by a light central co-ordination unit hosted by the OECD/PARIS21, supported by 15 international consultants, and included several national implementing teams (totalling some 100 staff) which designed and conducted pilot experiences in 16 countries of four continents. It delivered a series of case studies, national policy-oriented reports, methodological guidelines and two online resources: a substantive set of Training Materials and a worldwide database of relevant initiatives (available at www.metagora.org). The project also included the organisation of numerous meetings, workshops, regional conferences and training sessions in Asia, Latin-America, Francophone Africa and the Arab region, as well as two large Forums held in Paris. The results and significant lessons from Metagora are highlighted in a synthesis book: Measuring Human Rights and Democratic Governance, published as a special issue of the OECD Journal on Development (2008), Vol.9, No.2, 365 pp. (French and Spanish versions available): http://browse.oecdbookshop.org/oecd/pdfs/browseit/4308021E.PDF.
